It is the intent of the SECA Advisory Board to list local United Ways and their member agencies according to how they handle these designations.

Where local United Ways list member agencies with a 7 digit SECA code the donor's directed contribution is automatically sent to the selected agency. Where local United Ways list agencies but do not include a SECA code, the contributions are distributed through the local United Way's volunteer review process.

Each local United Way determined how they would be listed in the 2009 SECA booklet and any questions should be directed to the specific local United Way.
